Starting her career in private dental practice after earning her BChD in Dentistry, Dr. Kimmie-Dhansay developed a passion for research and public health. This led her back to statistics, where she now specializes in biostatistics, research methodology, and evidence-based dentistry. Her work focuses on Early Childhood Caries (ECC), Molar Incisor Hypomineralisation (MIH), and systematic reviews, with leadership roles in randomized clinical trials (DELTAFIL study) and national oral health surveys.

Her vision is to bridge the gap between clinical practice and statistical research, ensuring that oral healthcare interventions are guided by robust data, scientific evidence, and a commitment to public health advancement.
